Wyatt's smile radiates his aura and zest for life. Born healthy, Wyatt was struck with transverse myelitis (TM) at 7 months old in May 2013. TM is a one-in-a-million auto-immune response that damages the spinal cord. It left Wyatt paralyzed from the chest down, but it has not damaged his spirit.

Bodypoint first saw Wyatt in a news article featuring the youngest person to push a manual wheelchair. Of course, we liked the fact that he was using a Bodypoint hip belt and we've followed him on a Facebook page dedicated to his fight ever since.

"The Evoflex Pelvic Stabilizer is a great solution for pelvic positioning belts that are consistently falling down and getting lost in the wheelchair frame/base. If a belt gets caught in the wheel of a manual or power wheelchair, it can be problematic for the chair itself or even worse, a safety issue for the wheelchair user. The Evoflex ensures that the belt is accessible to the user and is protected from damaging the wheelchair by using stiffened end straps to keep the belt in place. The straps can also rotate down and out of the way (to be parallel to the seat rail) for people who perform lateral transfers. Additionally, the stiffened ends allow users with less manual dexterity to be able to independently use the pelvic belt. This concept is genius and alleviates many frustrations both in manual and power wheelchairs."

Through <u>Twitter</u>, we met Bodypoint user **@buschic** who lives in Ontario, Canada. She describes herself as: DisABLED and proud | Transit and accessibility advocate and geek.

Summarizing a few Twitter posts (140 characters or less), here's what she said about the PivotFit™ Shoulder Harness:

"I am a bigger woman, (4'9, 258lbs). I use a Permobil M300 HD. I have low trunk control in moving vehicles, especially if I'm tired or in pain. With my harness I can RELAX. NO SWEAT, NO FEAR. I'm on public transit buses, it STOPS my body from slamming forward, or slumping into a 'ball'. TTC in Toronto goes FAST. On para-transit, I can recline and tilt, with no pain, no 'flopping.' I'm on the bus for 90/120 minutes on average. I also love my BP lap belt and how both attach to my Permobil M300 HD."
